

The State of Kansas is pleased to announce the issue of the first e-Apostille under the suggested model of the Hague Conference on Private International Law and National Notary Association's electronic Apostille Pilot Program (e-APP).



PDF, Word, Other Document Types

- PDF chosen as foundation strong adoption, readily understood, suitable XML container and binary object container
- Word has been adopted by Delaware as next step
- Goal all document types, binary objects, etc.
- Shared Goal XML specification for Apostille?



Complementing This Movement

- E-SIGN/UETA exemption for public agencies
- Great progress on federated identity management standards in the United States
 - Important foundation to larger adoption of electronic documents among public agencies
 - National Strategy for Trusted Identities in Cyberspace (NSTIC)

Complementing This Movement

- First federal court order issued electronically
- State court systems rapidly moving to entirely electronic format (California's system is live)
- Many other governmental organizations rapidly becoming electronic (Vital Records, Property Records, etc.)



Delaware

- eApostilles Live by end of 2010
- Available to all corporate entities and lawyers (and legal assistants/paralegals) in all 50 states, territories, possessions
- Court of Chancery moving to eFiling
- Fully aligned with federal identity assurance standards
- Gemalto SmartCard Delaware trusted root
- Non-repudiation provided




Delaware Law Revision


- Title 29 §4309 (a) [http://notary.delaware.gov/]
- (c) The Governor may also appoint, as notaries public for electronic notarial acts, nonresidents of this State who otherwise meet the requirements of paragraphs (b)(1) and (b)(2)
- (2) Such individual is an attorney-at-law in good standing licensed in any state, commonwealth, territory, district or possession of the United States or such individual is a legal assistant or paralegal working under the direct supervision of an attorney-at-law in good standing licensed in any state, commonwealth, territory, district or possession of the United States and such attorney-at-law is a Delaware electronic notary and has previously submitted to the Secretary and had approved by the Secretary an application containing such information as the Secretary shall deem necessary and proper and demonstrating such attorney-at-law has a reasonable need for permitting 1 or more legal assistants or paralegals under that attorney-at-law's direct supervision to become an electronic notary under Delaware law; or

The digitized original of this copy consists of two core elements;

- The electronic 'xml' folder structure which contains the <u>Electronic Notarization</u> <u>original (.docx) and electronic forensics</u> to assist relying parties in proving the elemen of the <u>notarial</u> act (identity of parties, time, personal appearance) and document nonrepudiation.
- A.p.df copy that can serve as a copy of the original electronic version, which is provided below.




Predictions, Challenges

- Non-repudiation will be the key to "originality"




Certificate Trust in Adobe PDF - Default






Adobe PDF - Default






Adobe PDF - Adding Trusted Identity
